This symposium focuses on contemporary issues related to the hospitality and tourism industry. The author(s) requires a faculty advisor/mentor and should be enrolled as a junior or senior in a hospitality and tourism management program at an ICHRIE member institution.

Symposiums are usually non-scientific studies. However, submissions could be research, review, case study, or viewpoint with some research context. This research symposium is an opportunity

for ESD students, hospitality and tourism management students, faculty advisors/mentors, and industry professionals to learn and share various hospitality and tourism knowledge and experience from their various discoveries. This symposium would contribute to the hospitality and tourism industry profession's body of knowledge through the presentation and discussion of various studies about the hospitality and tourism industry. The best papers will be invited for publication in the symposium-affiliated journal.

The research advisor or mentor must first review all the potential presentations before submission to the ESD Undergraduate Research Committee. All the submissions will undergo a double-blind review process by the symposium paper review committee. The student must submit a two-page abstract to the symposium review committee for initial consideration.

Faculty Endorsement

The sponsoring faculty member's name and email address must be included with each submission. Papers submitted without sponsoring faculty member information will not be considered for presentation.

Submission Instructions

An electronic notice will be given on December 5, 2025, if your paper has been accepted for the research symposium. Authors of accepted abstracts will have until January 23, 2026, at 11:59 `pm EST to electronically submit their final papers in publishable form through the above-noted EasyChair link.

Proofing Your Submission

Information for the printed symposium program and the proceedings will be taken directly from the final paper submissions. Ensure all names are spelled correctly, citations are in order, and all other information is accurate.

Presentations and Best Paper Award

Authors will present their papers to students, faculty, and industry professionals as scheduled. The Paper Review Committee will select some outstanding papers for the Best Symposium Paper Awards.

To be selected, the author(s) must submit their final papers demonstrating proper research design, provide a comprehensive literature review, and exhibit possible implications for real-world problems. The final papers must follow the American Psychological Association formatting and style and are limited to 20 pages (including footnotes and exhibits). The paper must be submitted using 12-point font and double-spaced with one-inch margins.
