The applicant must be able to show evidence of a strong publication record or ongoing research, have a clear research agenda, work independently on research, and be willing to engage in collaborative scholarship with faculty and students across disciplines. The applicant should also be prepared to engage in service to the university, community, department, and profession.

Qualifications

The successful applicant must have a Ph.D. or terminal degree in hospitality management or a closely related field and/or at least one degree specifically in hospitality or tourism management. The successful candidate must have a demonstrated record of outstanding classroom teaching; an ability to connect with undergraduate students; the ability to work collaboratively with discipline-specific organizations in the region and the ability to articulate interest in actively participating in students' experiential learning opportunities. In addition, the applicant must demonstrate evidence of successful publications in peer-reviewed journals and a 3-5-year plan for an active scholarship agenda. Applicants are required to have professional work experience at the managerial level within the hospitality industry or closely related field. Strong ABD candidates will be considered with the condition that the successful candidate must have completed their PhD prior to the start date.
